**Minutes of the Meeting**

**1. Welcome and Opening Remarks:**

Dr. Vaishali Sahu, Dy. Director IQAC, welcomed all members and special invitees to the 21<sup>st</sup> IQAC meeting. She also welcomed Dr. Nidhi Agrawal, (COO & Engg. Head, NIA Agrocommodity Marketplace Pvt. Ltd. Gurugram), industry expert, and introduced her to the committee. Dr. Sahu briefed the members on the agenda items to be discussed during the meeting. The leave of absence of Dr. Pankaj Sharma and Mr. Vineet Gupta due to important meetings was noted on record. The 20<sup>th</sup> IQAC minutes held on 15<sup>th</sup> April 2026 were confirmed and closed with no further action.

**2. The NCU ASIC Conference:**

Dr. Vaishali Sahu briefed the members on the NCU-ASIC (Accreditation Service for International Schools, Colleges and Universities, UK) Conference that was successfully conducted on 30<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> March 2026. She informed the committee that the next edition of the conference is proposed to be held on 18<sup>th</sup>-19<sup>th</sup> February 2027, in collaboration with ASIC, UK. The committee appreciated the successful conduct of the event.

**3. Internal Academic Audit:**

Dr. Vaishali Sahu apprised the committee about the Internal Academic Audit of departments. The VC, Prof. (Dr.) Nupur Prakash, emphasized that the internal audit is an annual exercise at the department level as mandated by NAAC. It was resolved that:

- Self-assessment by departments is to be completed by 15<sup>th</sup> July 2026.
- Audit formats will be shared with all departments by IQAC.
- The internal audit inspection will commence from 20<sup>th</sup> July 2026.
- The audit self-assessment form is placed at **Annexure-I**.

**4. CO-PO Mapping and CLO-PLO Transition:**

The committee discussed the ongoing transition from CO-PO to CLO-PLO framework as resolved in the 20<sup>th</sup> IQAC meeting. The following important points were recorded:

- CO-PO mapping shall continue for the outgoing 2026 batch (existing programmes).
- The entry batch of 2026 and all subsequent batches will follow the CLO-PLO framework.
- A workshop on CO-PO mapping will be conducted in the first week of June by the Dean Academics.
- For all programmes CLO and PLO frameworks are to be developed and to be submitted to IQAC by 15<sup>th</sup> July 2026 for first year courses. For second year onwards the departments can prepare the same and submit to IQAC semester wise.
- For outgoing batch 2026, the programme CO-PO mapping is to be completed and should be presented in BoS with action taken report.

**5. Launch of New Programmes for AY 2025-26 and AY 2026-27:**

Heads of Departments presented brief writeups on new programmes proposed for launch. The following major points were presented:

- For AY 2025-26: 2 New Programmes and for AY2026-27: 8 New Programmes
- MDE: B.Tech ECE with specialization in Semiconductors and Robotics & AI.
- CSE: B.Tech CSE with specialization in Quantum Computing. The programme is anchored on four pillars: Network, Communication, and Computing. Dr. Nidhi Agrawal in Quantum Technology, provided inputs on the programme structure. The VC suggested that Dr. Nidhi may be invited to the Academic Council meeting for further inputs on the B.Tech Quantum Computing programme.

All newly launched programme in AY 2025-26 and 2026-27 are placed at **Annexure-II**.

**6. Inculcating the Culture of Startups at NCU – IIC Briefing:**

Dr. Anmol Bhatia, Chairman IIC briefed the committee on IIC's activities and calendar for 2026-27. He presented the IIC Activity Plan and proposed plan for strengthening startup culture at NCU. The key points discussed in the meeting are:

- The VC suggested targeting an IIC rating improvement from 3.0 to 3.5, with an annual plan to further improve to 5-star rating. She further suggested to submit detailed strategic plan for AY 2026-27.
- For NIIF detailed strategic plan for AY 2026-27 is requested for improving the startup culture and formation of startup companies in the long run.
- Prof. Sharda Vashisth informed the committee about the inaugural of MBMI lab in collaboration with CTIF Global Capsule (CGC) network, Denmark. VC requested the annual plan and utilizing model for engaging students in the MBMI (Multi Business Model Innovation) lab at NCU.
- Dr. Vandana suggested to include this MBMI lab during induction, including a 1-week summer internship in MBMI Lab, and suggested inviting school children for projects.
- An SOP is to be developed to connect the lab with students and provide service.
- Dr. Nidhi suggested introducing a startup culture involving PhD students.
- Adoption of an AI Academic Integration Framework for various programmes at NCU was presented by Dr. Vaishali. Further, department Heads presented the various courses and level of integration. IIC calendar and NIIF calendar is placed at **Annexure-III**.

**7. Faculty Induction Booklet, and Student Handbook:**


The Revised Faculty Induction handbook was presented by HR in the meeting. The VC directed that an undertaking '**Yes, I have read it**' shall be digitally signed, after which induction will be considered complete for the newly joined faculty members. This feature will come on the new LMS. Student Handbook was presented by Ms. Neetu Batra, Asst. Registrar. The VC directed that Attendance and Discipline should come as separate main headers in the handbook.

**8. IRO – Dual Degree, Semester Abroad, Summer Immersion, and MoUs:**

Dr. Sharda Vashisth (Dean IRO) presented a brief on the IRO activities and briefed the committee on Dual Degree, Semester Abroad, Summer Immersion programmes, and active MoUs (**Ref Annexure IV**). The VC and Dr. Nidhi Agrawal appreciated the efforts of IRO and suggested to further strengthen the student and faculty exchange programmes at NCU.

9. No other item was raised with the permission of the Chair. The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to all the members and invites.
