ABOUT NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

The National Service Scheme (NSS) is an Indian government-sponsored public service program conducted by the Department of Youth Affairs and Sports of the Government of India. Popularly known as NSS, the scheme was launched in Gandhiji's Centenary year, 1969. Aimed at developing a student's personality through community service, NSS is a voluntary association of young people in Colleges, Universities and at the +2 level in working for a better and improved campus-community linkage.

NSS HISTORY

National Service Scheme (NSS), was launched by the Ministry of Education and Culture, Govt. of India, in Mahatma Gandhi's Birth Centenary Year 1969, in collaboration with 37 Universities involving 40,000 students with a primary focus on the development of personality of students through community services. Mahatma Gandhi always insisted on the idea that students as youths should be involved in the nation-building process and service of the nation. He suggested that instead of undertaking academic research about economic and social disability, the students should do "something positive so that the life of the villagers might be raised to a higher material and moral level." Gandhiji insisted that the first duty of the students should be, not to treat their period of study as one of the opportunities for indulgence in intellectual luxury, but for preparing themselves for final dedication in the

service of those who provided the sinews of the nation with the national goods & services so essential to society. Therefore, fostering social responsibility, inculcating dedication, commitment to solving social problems and developing a personality through community service are the main aims of NSS. Today NSS has grown as one of the most prominent social service institutions and youth movements in the world with more than 38 lakhs of dedicated volunteers all over the country.

NSS AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The broad objectives of NSS are to

- Understand the community in which they work
- Understand themselves in relation to their community
- Identify the needs and problems of the community and involve them in the problem solving process
- Develop among themselves a sense of social and civic responsibility
- Utilize their knowledge in finding a practical solution to individual and community problems
- Develop the competence required for group living and sharing of responsibilities
- Gain skills in mobilizing community participation
- Acquire leadership qualities and a democratic attitude
- Develop the capacity to meet emergencies and natural disasters and
- Practice national integration and social harmony.

In short, NSS aims to inculcate social service in the student for the welfare of the humanity, sharing their services to society without bias and enhancing their standard of living while leading a life of dignity.

<u>1. PROJECT NOOR</u>



2. PROJECT PRAKRITI



sustainability performance in local areas by enhancing resource and waste management.




3. PROJECT PEHCHAAN




4. PROJECT NAARI

NSS NCU CHAPTER EVENTS 2023-24

1. ENVIRONMENT DAY PLEDGE

<u>DATE</u>: 5th June 2023 <u>MODE</u>: Offline

<u>AIM</u>: The aim of the event was to promote sustainable actions for a greener future, fostering environmental consciousness and creating a greener future of all.

EVENT:On the auspicious occasion of World Environment Day that is celebrated on 5th June every year, 20 volunteers of NSS NCU took a pledge to protect the environment. Objectives of Mission LiFE, an initiative of the Government of India were also fulfilled. All volunteers were enthusiastic and ecstatic to take concrete actions towards a sustainable and greener future and promote initiatives that restore ecosystems and preserve our planet's resources.

IMPACT: World Environment Day aligns with several SDGs, such as clean water and sanitation, affordable and clean energy, responsible consumption and production, and climate action. By promoting sustainable actions, the event contributed to achieving these goals.



2. PLANTATION DRIVE

DATE: 11th-17th August 2023

MODE: ONLINE

<u>AIM</u>: To honor our 'Motherland' and the brave souls who fought for India's independence through a plantation drive, as part of the "Meri Maati Mera Desh" campaign aligned with the "Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav" initiative.

EVENT: In commemoration of Independence Day, NSS NCU organized an online Plantation Drive inviting all NCU students to participate. As part of the **"Meri Maati Mera Desh"** campaign, students were encouraged to plant saplings in tribute to the sacrifices made by freedom fighters. Participants were required to share photographs of themselves planting a sapling, which were submitted through a designated Google Drive link.

IMPACT: The event garnered 5+ entries, successfully inspiring students to pay homage to those who laid down their lives for the nation's freedom. As recognition for their participation, students were awarded 2 community service hours. The initiative not only honored the past but also contributed to environmental conservation, embodying the spirit of the campaign.



3. VILLAGE VISIT TO GAWAL PAHADI

DATE: 21 August 2023 MODE: OFFLINE

<u>AIM:</u> To engage with the community of Gawal Pahadi Village, creating awareness on hygiene, sanitation, literacy, and legal knowledge while promoting overall rural development through active student participation.

EVENT: The NSS unit of NCU organized a community service visit to Gawal Pahadi Village on 21st August 2023. Over 200 students participated in activities like:

- Performing a Nukkad Natak to emphasize hygiene and sanitation.
- Cleaning village streets and public spaces.
- Imparting Legal and Digital Literacy to villagers.
- Conducting surveys to gather data on healthcare, education, and socio-economic conditions.

The event also served as an induction for new students, who actively contributed and earned credits for their participation.

IMPACT: The initiative fostered awareness on critical issues, improved cleanliness in the village, and enhanced the understanding of villagers regarding digital and legal literacy. Additionally, the comprehensive survey provided insights into the community's needs, supporting future development efforts. Students gained practical exposure to social work, strengthening their commitment to community service.



4. VILLAGE VISIT TO DAULATABAD

DATE: 22 August 2023 MODE: OFFLINE

<u>AIM:</u> To engage with the rural community of Daulatabad, Pataudi, fostering awareness on sanitation, hygiene, literacy, and legal issues while actively contributing to the community's development through practical initiatives.

EVENT DESCRIPTION: NSS NCU organized a community service visit to Daulatabad as part of its rural development initiatives. Over 100 university students participated in activities such as cleaning communal areas, conducting surveys, and teaching villagers about legal and digital literacy. A compelling Nukkad Natak by NSS volunteers emphasized the importance of sanitation and hygiene, followed by an interactive session encouraging open dialogue. Surveys were conducted to understand local challenges related to infrastructure, health, and education, while a home survey identified specific family needs. This visit also provided freshers an immersive experience in community service.

IMPACT: The event fostered increased awareness among villagers about hygiene, sanitation, and literacy. Students gained hands-on experience in community service, promoting empathy and social responsibility, while meaningful data was collected for targeted development efforts. The initiative strengthened NSS NCU's role in driving societal change.





5. VILLAGE VISIT TO SARHAUL

DATE: 25TH AUGUST, 2023 MODE: OFFLINE

<u>AIM:</u> To enhance societal awareness and make a positive contribution to the community. **<u>EVENT:</u>** The NSS chapter at NCU organized a village visit program in Sarhaul as a part of the three-day village visit. This event was designed to effectively connect with the local villagers, raise awareness about important subjects, and engage in initiatives like sanitation, cleanliness, education, and legal awareness. The initiative included visits to both the boy's and girl's schools and was focused on achieving specific goals. Each group was assigned certain targets, which included executing a cleanliness drive, imparting legal literacy, and conducting a village survey.

IMPACT: The impact of this initiative was evident as it not only facilitated meaningful interactions between participants and local children but also created a deeper understanding of their daily lives. In conclusion, this village visit organized by NSS NCU became a catalyst for positive change, fostering awareness, empathy, and a spirit of collaboration among the participants and the underprivileged children.



6. <u>NSS NCU ORIENTATION</u>

DATE: 29th September 2023 MODE: OFFLINE

<u>AIM</u>: To introduce new volunteers to the core and board members of NSS for the year 2023-24 and provide an opportunity for interaction with the ex-board members.

EVENT: The NSS Orientation for 2023-24 began with an inspiring speech by the faculty coordinators, motivating the new members to actively engage in the upcoming events and maintain the spirit and essence that NSS-NCU has fostered over the years. As a gesture of appreciation, mementos were presented to the faculty coordinators and the ex-board members.

IMPACT: The event succeeded in welcoming new volunteers into the NSS family, giving them a deeper understanding of its vision and opportunities for personal growth and social contribution. It fostered a sense of belonging and excitement among the volunteers, encouraging active participation in future activities.



7. <u>MENTAL HEALTH PANEL – PEER PRESSURE OR FEAR PRESSURE</u>

<u>DATE</u>: 4th October, 2023 <u>MODE</u>: OFFLINE

<u>AIM</u>: To address the critical issue of mental health among students and its impact on their holistic development, while providing insights and strategies to promote mental well-being.

EVENT: The National Service Scheme (NSS) at The NorthCap University organized a panel discussion on mental health, focusing on the theme "Peer Pressure or Fear Pressure." A distinguished panel of experts from the mental health field engaged in insightful discussions, providing practical advice and strategies to help students manage stress and maintain mental well-being.

The panel featured three renowned experts:

- Dr. Shilpa Gupta Founder and Trainer of the EmoAid program and Associate Director of the Centre for Child and Adolescent Wellbeing (CCAW).
- Dr. Samiksha Jain Assistant Professor of Psychology at NCU, with expertise in Cognitive Behavioral Therapy, SPSS, Number Analysis, Signature Analysis, and Career Counselling.
- Ms. Chetna Arora Co-founder and CEO of That Desi Psychologist, an organization promoting mental wellness on various issues, including sex education, parenting, and relationships.
- The panelists explored topics such as self-introspection, emotional acceptance, the impact of social media on mental health, academic pressure, and the importance of maintaining realistic expectations. Students were also provided with practical tips, including journaling, reading biographies, and focusing on learning rather than comparing themselves to others. Dr. Shilpa Gupta shared valuable stress management strategies, including mindfulness exercises, maintaining a balanced lifestyle, and the "box technique" for relaxation.

IMPACT: The event successfully raised awareness about mental health and provided students with realistic tools and strategies to manage stress and peer pressure. It encouraged them to take proactive steps towards mental well-being and seek help when necessary, fostering a healthier student community.



8. AMRIT KALASH YATRA

DATE: 26th October, 2023 MODE: OFFLINE

<u>AIM</u>: To pay tribute to the Veers and Veeranganas who dedicated and sacrificed their lives for the nation.

EVENT: This event was organised to encourage people to pay tribute to the Veers and Veeranganas who dedicated and sacrificed their lives for the nation. The event was attended by the faculty of The Northcap University and more than 65 students. Participants brought either rice or soil from their homes, which were then placed in two different pots. The participants rallied around the campus chanting slogans: "MERI MAATI MERA DESH" and "NSS NCU, NOT ME BUT YOU". A plantation drive was also conducted, with 75 saplings planted around the campus.

IMPACT: The Amrit Kalash Yatra serves as a tribute to national heroes who devoted their lives to the nation. The 'Meri Maati Mera Desh' program aims to emotionally connect every individual, family, and citizen with the idea of creating a great India. Soil is being collected from each household as a mark of respect to the earth and those who sacrificed for the country. 9. UNITY RUN & OATH


DATE: 31st October, 2023 MODE: OFFLINE

<u>**AIM**</u>: The Unity Run aimed to promote the importance of mental and physical well-being while fostering a sense of unity and togetherness among participants through collective action.

EVENT: On October 31, 2023, NSS NCU organized the Unity Run at The Northcap University to commemorate the birth anniversary of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, the Iron Man of India. Event: The drive was part of NSS NCU's Project Naari. Donation boxes placed in university cafes encouraged contributions of sanitary napkins and non-perishable food items from students. The initiative received an overwhelming response, with donations from 120 students. Volunteers distributed the collected items to underprivileged individuals near Jharsa Chowk, fostering a spirit of empathy and support within the community.

11. TOY & CRAFT FOR CAUSE DONATION

DATE: 8-10th November, 2023 **MODE**: OFFLINE

AIM: To bring joy and creative expression to children in need.

EVENT: This drive aimed to bring joy and creative expression to children in need. NSS volunteers placed donation boxes in university cafes for students to donate toys, handmade crafts, craft supplies, and other items. Around 60 students participated in the drive. The collected items were distributed to children of different age groups at Jharsa Chowk.

12. INTERNATIONAL MEN'S DAY

DATE: 17th November, 2023 **MODE:** Offline

<u>AIM</u>: To recognize and appreciate the contributions of male faculty and staff members, while promoting an understanding of International Men's Day and advocating for men's mental well-being.

EVENT: The volunteers of NSS NCU celebrated International Men's Day as a tribute to the achievements and contributions of male faculty and staff members at the university. 13. <u>CLEANLINESS DRIVE</u> <u>DATE:</u> 23rd November 2023 <u>MODE:</u> OFFLINE

AIM: To promote cleanliness and environmental responsibility in the university's surrounding areas. **EVENT:** A cleanliness drive was organized by NSS NCU where all its volunteers participated enthusiastically. The focus areas included the university's surrounding neighborhoods, OTS café stalls, nearby parks, the university road, and the road connecting Palam Vihar to the university. The drive was concluded within 2 hours with over 33 NSS volunteers participating, making it a huge success. Volunteers practiced good hygiene by wearing face masks and gloves. IMPACT: The drive promoted cleanliness and environmental responsibility, encouraging volunteers and the community to maintain hygiene and a clean environment.






14. WEBINAR ON CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE POCSO ACT 2012

DATE: 26th November, 2023 MODE: ONLINE

<u>AIM</u>: To raise awareness about the Protection of Children from Sexual Offenses Act 2012 (POCSO) and educate individuals on preventing child sexual abuse.

EVENT: NSS NCU, in partnership with Sakshi (a gender-equality-focused NGO), hosted a webinar under The Rakshin Project titled "Stopping Child Sexual Abuse." The session, led by Ms. Saniya Mahajan, Assistant Manager at TRP, highlighted the importance of community involvement, education, and preventive measures to combat child sexual abuse. The webinar provided an overview of the Rakshin Project's role in protecting children from sexual offences.

IMPACT: The webinar engaged over 50 attendees, fostering awareness and encouraging active participation in addressing child sexual abuse. The collaboration underscored the importance of collective action in tackling critical societal issues.



15. NATIONAL SOCIAL SUMMIT- IIT ROORKEE

DATE: 9-11th February 2024 MODE: Offline

Aim: To participate in the National Social Summit 2024, spreading awareness on sustainability and empowerment, and connecting with like-minded individuals.

Event: NSS NCU's team attended the summit, performed a Nukkad Natak on sustainability, attended webinars, and participated in Esports.

Impact: The summit provided a platform for students and volunteers to connect with like-minded individuals, exchange ideas, and hold meaningful discussions. This promoted the ideals of NSS NCU and expanded the scope for change and growth. Notably, Sareesha Chawla secured the first position in the Policy Case Competition, reflecting the high caliber of talent nurtured within our institution.





16. <u>SEMINAR: MEN'S MENTAL HEALTH</u> <u>DATE:</u> 5TH APRIL, 2024 <u>MODE:</u> OFFLINE

Aim: To raise awareness about the challenges men face in expressing emotions and addressing mental health, and to promote understanding and kindness in creating supportive environments.

Event Description: On April 5, 2024, NSS organized a seminar titled "*Men's Mental Health: Importance and Challenges*" under Project Noor at the university. The session featured Mr. Arjun Gupta, a counseling psychologist and writer, who shared his personal experiences with clinical depression and suicidality. He addressed the societal and biological factors contributing to men's reluctance to express emotions, emphasizing psycho-social conditioning and its long-term effects. Through an engaging analysis, Mr. Gupta discussed the unintended consequences of emotional repression, such as increased frustration and mental health crises, including suicide. The seminar underscored the importance of empathy and creating a safe space for men to share their feelings, fostering a deeper understanding among attendees.

IMPACT: The seminar raised awareness about the stigma surrounding men's mental health and the need for open communication. It provided valuable insights into the psycho-social conditioning that affects men's emotional expression. Attendees gained an understanding of the importance of creating supportive and empathetic environment. The event highlighted the alarming statistics of male suicides, prompting action and awareness. Participants left motivated to treat men with greater kindness and encourage them to share their thoughts and emotions openly.



17. CLUB FIESTA (T-SHIRT PAINTING & SLAM POETRY)

<u>DATE:</u> 10TH APRIL 2024 <u>MODE:</u> OFFLINE

<u>AIM:</u> The Club Fiesta aimed to promote awareness and dialogue on key societal issues through creative outlets, fostering a sense of inclusivity, empowerment, and sustainability among participants. **<u>EVENT:</u>** On April 10, 2024, The NorthCap University's National Service Scheme (NSS) participated in the university's annual Club Fiesta. The event featured two activities: a t-shirt painting session and a slam poetry contest. Both revolved around themes of NSS initiatives: Project Noor (mental health), Project Naari (women empowerment), Project Pehchaan (LGBTQIA+ inclusivity), and Project Prakriti (environmental sustainability). Participants showcased their creativity by designing t-shirts and reciting poems that highlighted these causes. The engaging discussions and artistic expressions created a platform for thoughtful reflection and collective learning.

IMPACT: The events successfully facilitated meaningful conversations, inspired awareness, and empowered participants to contribute towards inclusivity, gender equality, mental health, and environmental conservation through creative expression.





18. <u>PEER EDUCATION WEEK</u>

DATE: 19TH, 23RD & 24TH APRIL, 2024 MODE: OFFLINE

AIM: To foster social engagement and awareness among 5th-grade students by addressing important topics such as hygiene, nutrition, emotional expression, respect, and more, promoting holistic development and social responsibility.

EVENT: The National Service Scheme (NSS) at NCU organized a dynamic three-day event at the Government Primary School, Carterpuri, aimed at engaging and educating school students on various essential life skills and values. Over the course of three days, 20 dedicated volunteers formed 8 groups, each responsible for facilitating interactive sessions with a total of approximately 200 5th-grade students. The event kicked off with ice-breaking activities to help participants bond and set a tone of inclusivity and engagement. Through creative and interactive activities, the volunteers introduced a wide range of topics designed to promote personal development, social awareness, and positive behavior. Topics Covered: Road Safety, Food and Fitness, Controlling Anger Through Meditation, Importance of Activeness, Respect Towards Everyone and Everything, Animal Care, Expressing Gratitude to Parents, Emotional Expressions, Hygiene, Gratitude Towards Everything.

IMPACT: The event successfully created a platform for students to reflect on various personal development topics not typically covered in their textbooks. participants demonstrated increased awareness and openness toward the discussed themes, showing a positive shift in attitudes and behaviours. The sessions sparked ongoing dialogue and promoted actionable change within the school community.
