School of Law

Training Programme on New Criminal Laws of 2023 for Haryana Police Personnel

The School of Law at The NorthCap University organised a collaborative training programme on the New Criminal Laws of 2023, aimed to apprise police personnel of Haryana on recent legislative changes and their implications. Held on 30th April, the event featured three enlightening sessions, conducted by Prof. Archana Sarma (Head, School of Law) and Dr. Jasvir Singh (IPS Officer, Govt. of India), that delved into the intricacies of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sahita (BNS), Bharatiya Nagrik Suraksha Sahita (BNSS), and an interactive discussion led by students that focused on legal interlinkages between BNSS and Bharitya Sakshaya Adhinayam, discussing their implications for law enforcement and judicial proceedings.



IX Edition NCU National Moot Court Competition

On 19th and 20th April, The NorthCap University organised its IX Edition of the National Moot Court Competition on the themes of Environmental Law & Sustainable Construction Practices, that showcased a confluence of legal acumen and scholarly rigour. The competition commenced with an inauguration by Hon'ble Justice Anish Dayal, emphasising the holistic development of aspiring lawyers and the value of real-world experiences.

Participants from Manav Rachna University emerged as the winners of the competition, earning a cash prize of ₹15,000, and the team from Lloyd Law School secured the runners-up position, earning a cash prize of Indian Rupee 10,000. Additionally, individual brilliance was also recognized with awards for Best Female and Male Mooters, bagged by Symbiosis Law School, Pune

and UPES, Dehradun respectively. Both the best mooters received a cash prize of ₹5,000 each. The best Memorial award was also bagged by Manav Rachna University in the spirit of celebrating exemplary written submissions, highlighting scholarly rigour and earning them a cash prize of ₹5,000.

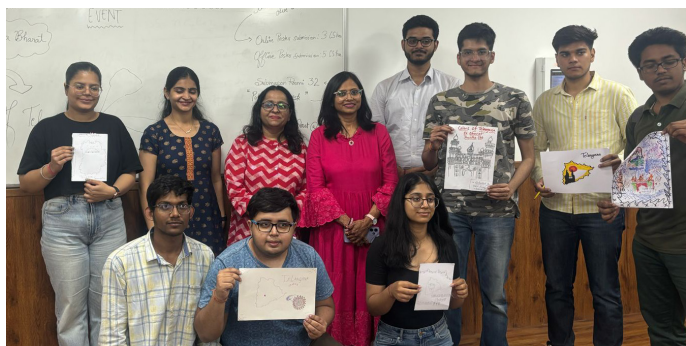
CPR and Basic Life Saving Skills
