The objective of the session was to provide an in-depth understanding of crucial GST topics essential for anyone entering the business world. The session covered: Understanding GST Registration; Mastering Tax Invoices; Credit and Debit Notes; GST Returns and Compliance; GST Audits and Assessments under GST; Taxability of E-Commerce; Anti-Profitteering Measures; Avoidance of Dual Control.

### Department of Multidisciplinary Engineering

#### Six Sigma Yellow Belt Training Programme

On 14th November, the American Society for Quality (ASQ) Student Chapter, NCU, organised a Six Sigma Yellow Belt Training Programme. A total of 48 students from diverse disciplines, including BTech, BCA, BBA, BCom (Hons), and others, attended the program, out of which 40 participants qualified for the certificate, meeting the eligibility criteria of 100% attendance and a minimum score of 60% in the final assessment. The training featured expert sessions by Dr. Anmol Bhatia (Assistant Professor, NCU), Mr. Danish Kapoor (Technology Audit Manager, Protiviti India Limited), and Mr. C.N. Saikumar (Deputy General Manager, Maruti Suzuki India Ltd.). The programme covered core Six Sigma principles and the DMAIC methodology (Define, Measure, Analyse, Improve, Control), with a focus on the Voice of the Customer (VOC), risk management using FMEA, and root cause analysis tools like Pareto charts and 5 Whys. The programme also included engaging case studies and hands-on activities, ensuring practical application of concepts. The event concluded with a final assessment to evaluate participants' understanding. The session was coordinated by Dr. Anmol Bhatia and Dr. Amit Dangi.



### NCU Students and Faculty Shine at International Multibusiness Modelling Programme

Dr. Anmol Bhatia, along with a team of five students – Pratham Panchal (BTech - Mechanical, Final Year), Sparsh Agarwal (BTech - ECE, Final Year), Dhruv Tomar (BTech - ECE, Final Year), Harshwardhan Jain (BTech - CSE, Third Year), and Kushagra Bharadwaj (BCom, Second Year) – participated in the Multibusiness Modelling and Innovation (MBMI) Training Programme organised by CTIF Global Capsule (CGC), Denmark, from 17th to 20th November at Sharda University, Noida. The programme included rigorous training sessions conducted by Prof. Peter Lindgren (Vice President, CGC, Denmark). During the course, the participants were assigned a business case of a Danish company. The team analysed the case, identified opportunities for improvement, and presented their innovative solutions using Bee-Business Tools. Their presentation and ideas impressed Prof. Peter, who acknowledged the team's efforts and creativity. As an outcome of this course, Prof. Peter Lindgren invited all participants to Denmark to collaborate with the targeted Danish companies through a three-week Multibusiness Modelling and Innovation (MBMI) course, with a full course fee waiver to all team members.



#### ASQ Workshop on Quality Management

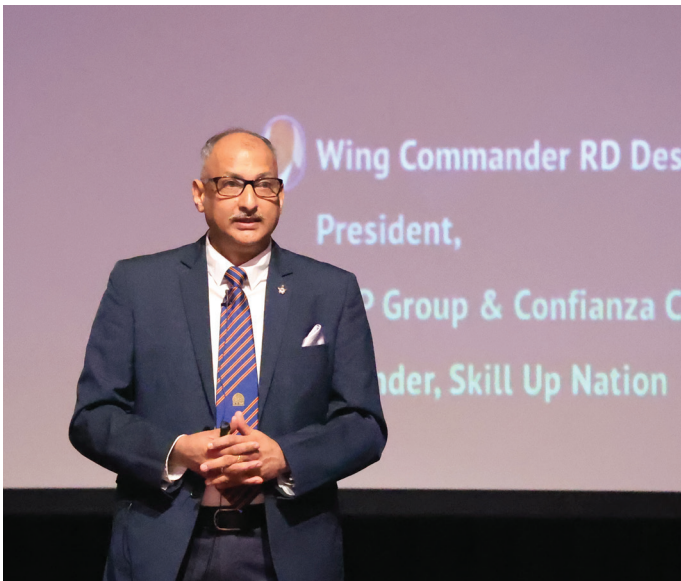


## Navigating the Transition: Key Behavioural Insights for Thriving in the Corporate World

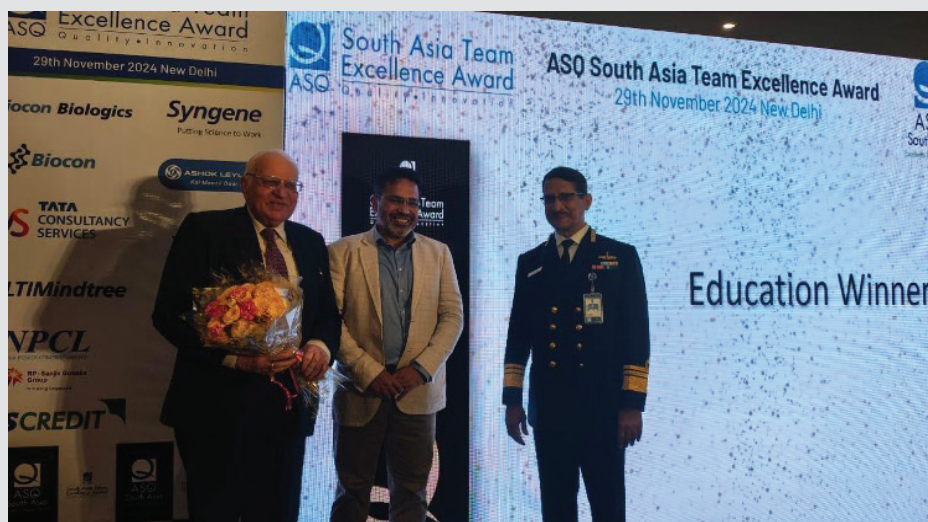


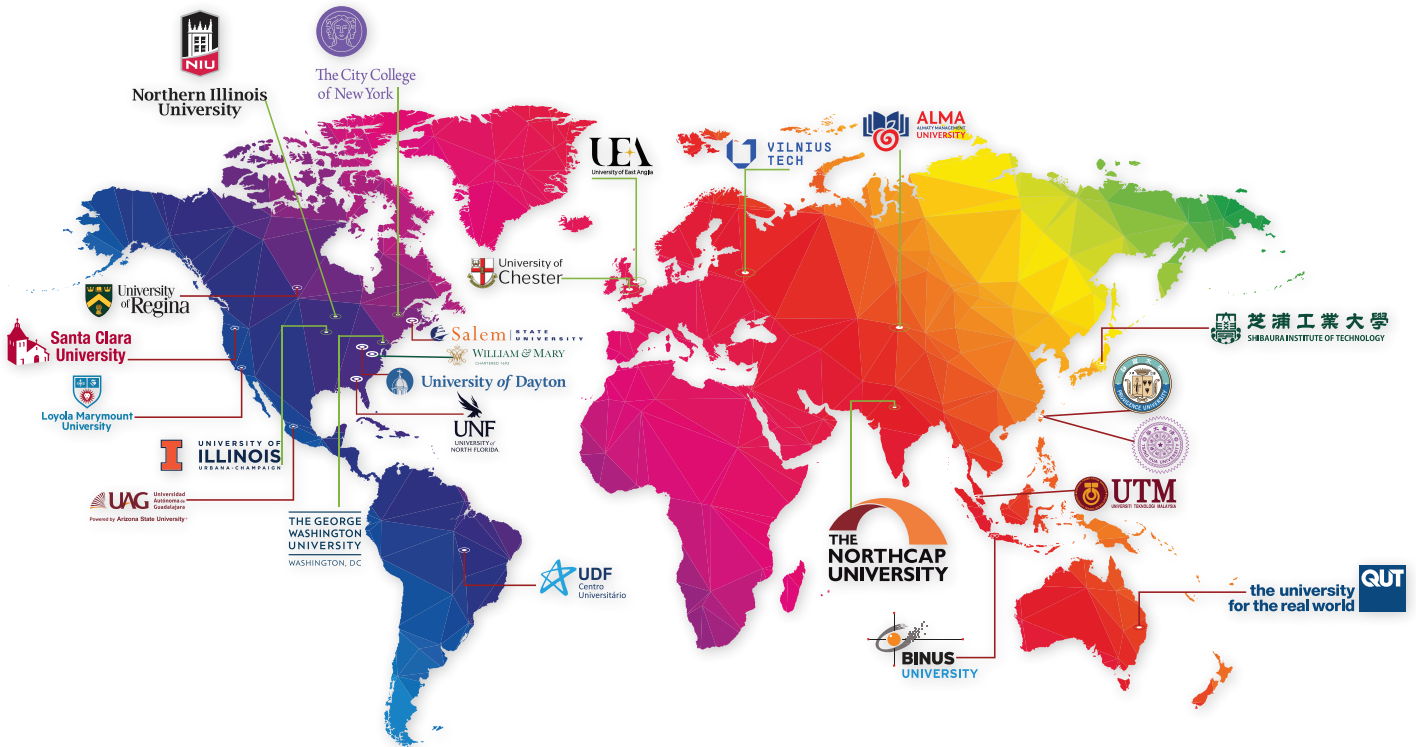
